

Bobble and Weave Blanket

You can use any yarn and any hook for this blanket. Caron Colorama Bamboo Blend and Premier Yarns Sweet Roll Frostie are worsted weight 4 yarns. The size of your blanket will change if you use a different size yarn. A smaller or lighter weight yarn will yield a smaller blanket unless you chain more at the start. A larger or heavier weight yarn will yield a larger blanket so adjusting the amount of chains to a smaller number will help if you don't want a very large blanket.

Either way, pay attention to the length of your chain while working. Measure your chain if you need, to ensure that you are getting the right size you desire.

I started my blanket with Caron Colorama Bamboo Blend creating a foundation chain of 168 + 6. This gave me a blanket that was 54 inches wide. The Premier Yarns Sweet Roll Frostie blanket was 32 inches wide and the foundation chain of 84 plus 6. The blanket I made with Caron Anniversary Cake was a chain of 91 + 6. That yielded a blanket that was 42 inches wide.

All of my blankets I used the recommended hook size per the label. The hook you choose can also alter the size of your blanket.

Your foundation chain can be any multiple of seven plus six. So get your multiple of seven, once you are there chain six more. Stitches used and their abbreviations are chain(ch), single crochet(sc), double crochet(dc), and bobble(b).

Special stitch definition: Bobble is double crochet four times into the chain space. Then, remove your hook from the loop that is on it and put your hook into the first double crochet you made. Then you will put the loop back on your hook and pull through. Odd rows are the wrong side of the work. Bobbles will be worked on the right side of work only. Chain three is counted as a double crochet at beginning of row. Chain four counts as a double crochet, chain one.

Pattern

Chain your multiple of seven, then add six more.

Row One:

Single crochet in the second chain from the hook. Chain three, skip next three chains, single crochet in the next chain.

Chain three, skip the next two chains, single crochet in the next chain.

Repeat this across, single crochet in your last chain.

Row Two:

Chain three, turn. Four double crochet in the first chain three space. Chain one, bobble in the next chain three space. Chain one. Four double crochet in the next chain three space.

Repeat this all the way across. Double crochet in the last stitch.

Row Three:

Chain one, turn. Single crochet in the first double crochet. Chain three, skip the next four double crochet. Single crochet in the next chain one space. Chain three, skip next bobble, single crochet in the next chain one space.

Repeat this across. End row with a single crochet in the last stitch. Do not put a single crochet in between the last set of stitches and the chain three.

Row Four:

Chain four, turn. Bobble in the next chain three space. Chain one. Four double crochet in the next chain three space. Chain one.

Repeat this across, end row with a double crochet in the last stitch.

Row Five:

Chain one, turn. Single crochet in the first double crochet. Chain three, skip next bobble and single crochet in the next chain one space. Chain three, skip the next four double crochet and single crochet in the next chain one space.

Repeat this across ending the row with a single crochet in the third chain of the chain four.

Repeat Rows TWO THROUGH FIVE for pattern until you get the length of the blanket you desire.

Edging

It is best to leave off on a row that is single crochet and chains. You can put a single crochet in each stitch around the blanket no matter what row you left on though.

Make sure you aren't putting too many stitches, OR too little amount of stitches. Too little can lead to puckering of your blanket edge and too many stitches can lead to ruffling on your edge.

Put your hook in wherever it is comfortable and put a single crochet.

Make sure to put three single crochets in each corner.

If you want to make sure all sides are equal in stitch count, count each side and match the opposite side with the same number of stitches.

On my blanket that I used the Caron Anniversary Cake, I did two rounds of single crochet for the edging.

Repeat Rows TWO THROUGH FIVE abbreviated

Row Two:

CH3, turn. 4DC in the first ch3 sp. CH1, B in the next CH3 sp. CH1, 4DC in the next CH3 sp.

Repeat across. DC in the last.

Row Three:

CH1, turn. SC in the first dc. CH3, sk the next 4dc. SC in the next ch1 sp. Ch3, sk next B, sc in the next ch1 sp.

Repeat across. End row with a sc in the last stitch. Do not put a single crochet in between the last set of stitches and the chain three.

Row Four:

CH4, turn. B in the next ch3 sp. CH1. 4DC in the next ch3 sp. CH1. Repeat

across, end with dc in the last.

Row Five:

CH1, turn. SC in the first dc. CH3, sk next b and sc in the next ch1 sp. CH3, sk the next 4dc and sc in the next ch1 sp.

Repeat this across ending the row with a single crochet in the third chain of the chain four.
